

# VOLUNTEER BC



Volunteerism is undeniably a core component of a healthy British Columbia. 1.5 million BC volunteers contribute 114 million hours a year to better communities all across the province. That's equivalent to 60,000 full-time jobs. This volunteer force (combined with the 147,000 paid staff that work in the over 20,000 BC nonprofit and voluntary organizations) makes the voluntary sector one of the largest social and economic drivers in the province, generating \$11 billion in annual revenues.

For over 30 years, Volunteer BC has been the provincial leader in promoting the value and impact of volunteerism and enhancing the abilities of volunteer-involving organizations. Volunteer BC mobilizes the collaborative spirit, expertise and energy of all participants in the volunteerism movement to build a better British Columbia.

## OUR MEMBERS

As a provincial association, Volunteer BC has a diverse membership – from local volunteer centres to organizations involving hundreds of volunteers, from smaller rural community agencies to larger provincial societies with branch offices scattered across BC.

And through the common thread of volunteerism, Volunteer BC is one of the only provincial voices with a multi-sectoral membership, representing the common interests of organizations that traditionally fit into different sectors.

## OUR NETWORKS

The Volunteer BC membership includes two strong and expansive networks that are at the centre of all aspects of the volunteer experience and that are capable of reaching almost every volunteer in the province.

Over 30 volunteer centres province wide form our primary network. They are local catalysts of community involvement, act as clearinghouses of resources to connect individuals to volunteer opportunities, and provide support to local and grassroots organizations in involving volunteers.

Volunteer BC is also a founder of the Voluntary Organizations Consortium of BC (VOCBC) - convening network with a broad membership, provincial and national connections, and extensive knowledge of the sector. Consortium members (over 30 organizations and counting) are provincial in scope and involve volunteers in a variety of areas, including sport, recreation, the arts, health, education, and social services, to name a few.

These sites allow volunteer centres and communities across the province to promote volunteer opportunities online.

Volunteer BC also partners on initiatives that help foster more volunteering, including the Culturally Welcoming Volunteer Program. Our annual Volunteer Week Photo Contest during National Volunteer Week continues to grow each year.

Our commitment to supporting and providing quality learning opportunities is a key part of the overall growth and sustainability of the sector and the volunteer management profession. Volunteer BC regularly hosts workshops and training opportunities. Our annual flagship event is Volunteer Futures - training event for voluntary organizations.

## CAPACITY BUILDING

Strengthening the capacity of our network of volunteer centres is at the core of our history and continues to be a key part of the activities we undertake as an organization. A strong volunteer centre means a stronger volunteer core in a community. We partner on the Culturally Welcoming Volunteer Program which helps increase the capacity and build the relationships between the volunteer centres, non profits and immigrant serving agencies in their community.
