OUR IMPACT

Volunteerism is a core component of a healthy and strong BC non-profit sector. BC Volunteers contribute over 269 million hours a year to improve communities throughout the province. Our strength is promoting the value and importance of volunteerism and advocating for volunteer-involved organizations and non-profits.







ADVOCACY & PARTNERSHIPS IN ACTION

Our successful advocacy has been built on great relationships, and we work tirelessly to advocate for and on behalf of volunteers and volunteer-involving groups to ensure the value of volunteering is recognized. We participate in national and provincial roundtables to ensure our voices are heard.

HIGHLIGHTS

- **National Volunteer Strategy:** Volunteer BC participated in the committee creating a National Strategy with Volunteer Canada
- **BC Non-Profit Network:** Continue to have a voice at the table with the NPN coordinated by Vantage Point.
- Connecting with Sector Leaders: We remain connected with Volunteer Canada, Board Voice, the Federation of Social Services, Vantage Point and many other provincial organizations working together to build a stronger non-profit sector.
- **Advocacy:** Partnered on letters with other provincial organizations to government officials, asking for measures to help charities and non-profit organizations continue their valuable work.
- **Outreach:** Expanded communication with relevant content for the non-profit sector, continued Community Engagement Trainings provincially.

ACCESS TO EDUCATION

We are committed to supporting and providing accessible learning opportunities for volunteer engagement. Hosting 6 webinars and promoting 33 others. Members were provided discounts to other provincial training organizations in 2025.

IN THE COMMUNITY

Volunteer BC, along with several volunteer centers, hosted virtual, hybrid and in-person Community Engagement (CET) Sessions around the province. Over 330 participants attended to meet the Volunteer BC Board, network, exchange ideas and learn best practices in volunteer engagement. CET sessions took place in Nanaimo, Kelowna and Fraser Valley in 2025.
